



Welcome to the Sun Life Health Family Medicine Residency Program in Casa Grande, Arizona.

The Sun Life Health Family Medicine Residency Program is a 4-4-4 residency program, welcoming four residents per class for a total of 12 residents across three years of training. The program is part of the Arizona AHEC Primary Care Consortium Program, sponsored by Arizona Area Health Education Centers at The University of Arizona. Built on a unique consortium-based model, the program brings together FQHC-based outpatient primary care, local adult inpatient medicine and regional pediatric hospital experience to prepare residents for the full scope of family medicine.

Residents spend a significant portion of their training on the brand-new Sun Life Health Casa Grande Medical Campus, which brings together the Continuity Residency Clinic, pediatrics and women's health in one community-based setting. This connected campus allows residents to build long-term relationships with patients and families while working alongside complementary primary care services. As part of a Federally Qualified Health Center, residents gain meaningful experience caring for a diverse and medically underserved population across all stages of life.

Hospital training complements the outpatient experience. Residents complete adult inpatient medicine and subspecialty training at Banner Casa Grande Medical Center, the program's main hospital site, inpatient pediatrics at Banner Children's at Desert in Mesa and OB/Gyn training at Banner Ocotillo Medical Center. Together, these sites provide broad, balanced clinical training across outpatient, inpatient and pediatric care settings.

Our curriculum is designed to prepare residents with the clinical knowledge, practical skills and professional confidence needed to provide comprehensive family medicine care. With dedicated faculty support and a strong focus on whole-person care, our goal is to graduate compassionate, capable family physicians who are ready to serve medically underserved communities with skill, purpose and commitment.
